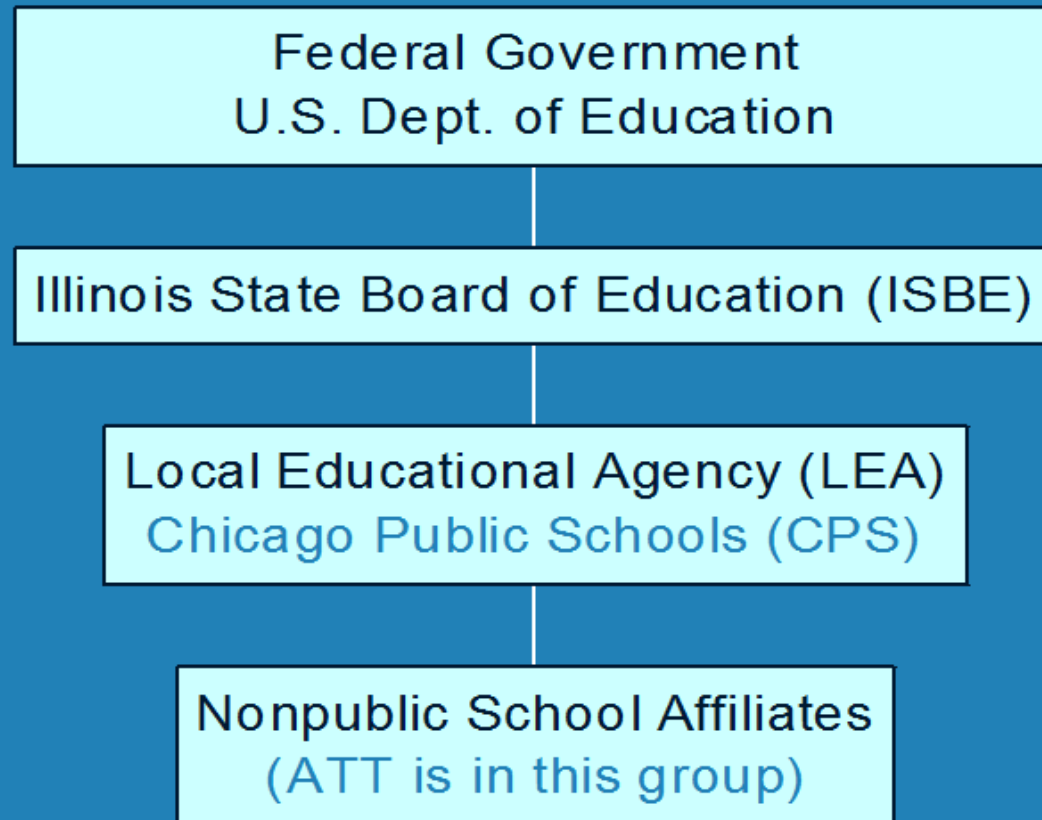

Federal Title Programs

ESSA: Every Student Succeeds Act

Title I

- Funds are used for math and reading remediation for eligible students, academic coaching, school counseling, professional development, fine arts, family engagement, ACT/SAT college prep.
- The ATT was instrumental in getting the alternative method of poverty data collection (i.e. proportionality) approved by CPS which brought Title I to our Chicago and Skokie/suburban elementary and high schools.
- The ATT was also instrumental in getting the Solomon School district in Peterson Park eligible for Title I Services.

FY 23 Dollars (Services) Allocated to Title I -- all ATT schools

- Remedial Instructional Services directly to ATT Schools (including Skokie for the Chicago students) \$747,375 (Provided by Catapult Learning, Msquared Learning, and Fran Center)

From Pooled Nonpublic Dollars:

- Professional Development \$627,203
- Academic Coaching \$432,190
- School Counseling: \$54,125
- Family Engagement \$69,351
- Fine Arts \$72,497



Federal Title Programs

ESSA: Every Student Succeeds Act

Individuals with Disabilities in Education Act (IDEA)

- Funds are used for special education services for eligible students.
- The ATT was instrumental in improving the multi-step eligibility process.



FY 23 Dollars (Services) Allocated to IDEA proportionate share - all ATT Chicago schools

- Special Education services and materials for eligible students

\$234,719

Skokie elementary schools receive services from

Federal Title Programs

ESSA: Every Student Succeeds Act

Title IIA (Professional Development)

- Funds are used by ATT schools for attendance at professional development conferences, for in-school workshops, and to pay consultants who give in-services in the core-curricular subject areas.



FY 23 Dollars (Services) Allocated to **Title IIA** -- all ATT Chicago schools

- Professional development in the core curriculum subjects

\$189,367

Skokie schools receive their funding from their local LEA's.



Federal Title Programs

ESSA: Every Student Succeeds Act

Title III (Limited English Proficient Programs)

- Funds are used in improving the teaching of English to foreign students. Foreign students are identified as being in the U.S. less than 3 years and in grades K-12. There was no special funding for immigrant students this year.



FY 23 Dollars (Services) Allocated to **Title III** -- all ATT Chicago schools

- Limited English proficient (based on CPS testing) programs and materials

ESSA: Every Student Succeeds Act

Title IV (Student Support and Academic Enrichment)

- Funds are used by ATT schools for student support and academic enrichment programs, social-emotional support of students, safe and healthy school environments, and technology infrastructure/enhancement.



FY 23 Dollars (Services) Allocated to **Title IV** -- all ATT Chicago schools

- Student Support and Academic Enrichment

\$195,046

Skokie schools receive their funding from their local LEA's.

ATT's Role in ESSA

- Mandatory consultation with the LEA
- Liaison to individual nonpublic schools
- Processing the large volume of required paperwork and documentation



ATT's Role in State Programs

Liaison to individual nonpublic schools

- ISBE Recognition Process
- Teacher Certification
- On planning team for annual state nonpublic conference
