If the teacher uses this knowledge strategically, he/she can design the student's daily experience to optimize the student's behavior and engagement with the educational activities that are built into the lessons.

- What are the typical arousal levels that our students experience daily?
- How do we predict where they will be at different points of the day?
- How do the preceding activities move or change arousal?
- Are some kids more prone to certain arousal states?
- Can I modify for a student who is an exception?
