Practical & Powerful Techniques to Teach Problem-Solving, Responsibility, Resiliency, & Independence to Young People (LE)

How AI (Artificial Intelligence) Can Help You Prepare

We'll also look at a tool that helps create interactive presentations from scratch, far faster than doing it manually. The idea is to leverage these tools to make you a more effective and efficient teacher.

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Making Thinking Visible: Building Routines that Boost Student Engagement and Thinking Skills (CI)

Based off of Harvard's Project Zero, Visible Thinking Routines are a novel approach to problem solving and critical thinking that enables teachers and students to approach a question from a number of different perspectives. Educators will workshop these strategies that can be applied to all aspects of education, from vocabulary to *Talmud*.

From Connection to Cooperation: Creating Effective Classroom Management Strategies Using Attachment Theory and Social-Emotional Learning (LE)
