SESSION 1: HOW DO WE ASK GOOD QUESTIONS?

Why are questions so important to education? From the Pesach Seder to the classroom, questions are a fundamental tool for learning. In this session we will explore how to use questions for engagement, deep thought, and assessment.

SESSION 2: SEEING INSIDE THEIR HEADS

It can be difficult to help students when we don't know what is going through their heads. To help students overcome obstacles in their thinking, we need to know what those obstacles are. In math class, the instruction *show your work* gives us a glimpse into each student's thought process. In this session we will look at ways to make thinking visible across all subjects.
